<u>Donor Performance, Main Indicators</u>	❖ <b>Total ODA Disbursements (all DAC members)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Principal components of ODA as accepted by DAC/OECD differentiating between grants and loans and showing non-transfer items as well as repayments</li> <li>➤ ODA volumes including or excluding items, which do not represent real transfers to developing countries or which are repayable</li> <li>➤ Donor efforts in relation to Gross National Income (GNI) including or excluding non-transfer items and lending</li> </ul>
	❖ <b>ODA Disbursements for Health (European DAC members)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Contributions for health, which are coincident with relevant resource needs estimates</li> <li>➤ ODA flows taking into account financial terms and imputable repayments</li> <li>➤ Financial efforts in support of health in relation to GNI differentiating between grants and loans</li> <li>➤ Importance of health in relation to total ODA</li> </ul>
